• FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 23:



Attendance is one of the most powerful predictors of academic achievement and having your student in their seat, ready to learn for the entire school day will benefit them, their classmates, and our whole school community.

Per Wisconsin Statute 118.15 (5), parents are allowed to excuse their child from school for up to 5 days per semester and 10 days per school year, this includes tardiness. If you have previously qualified for these benefits, please fill out the free and reduced lunch application by October 17, 2022, if you have not done so already.


The district is unable to provide "FREE" breakfast and lunch meals to all students for the 2022-23 academic year due to federal guidelines. With this in mind, we strongly encourage all families who are in need of financial

assistance to complete a free and reduced lunch application prior to the start of the school year. You can complete this application online in your parent portal on Infinite Campus by following this link.

It is our mission to provide all students with a healthy and nutritious meal every day and this program is vital in accomplishing that mission. In addition, these applications help ensure that the District receives additional federal funding to help economically disadvantaged students in the classroom, allows the Food Service Department to provide free community meals during the summer and qualifies the District for additional state funding to provide property tax relief to our local taxpayers. With this in mind, we encourage any family who needs to complete these applications even if they are unsure if they will qualify. Phoenix Middle School started off our school year with a welcome back school-wide assembly for all students and staff. It was an opportunity for our students to get to know our staff members and celebrate the start of a new school year. We also had a balloon game with a team from each grade level as well as a staff team. The staff team came in first place!!! We look forward to a re-match at our next assembly.

Our administrative team, Amanda Urmanski (Principal) and Blake Rowe (Associate Principal) visited all classrooms on the second day of school

to meet with students to discuss our school-wide expectations at Phoenix Middle School. We continue to focus on the Comet Code: Be Respectful, Be Responsible, Be Safe, and Be a Learner. We shared our expectations for student behavior and the potential consequences when students are not meeting the Comet Code.

Our third day of school was spent going through our "Cool Tools". This is part of our Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS - which is our Comet Code) where students are explicitly taught expectations in certain locations throughout the building. Students

were specifically taught what the expectations are in the bathrooms, in the cafeteria, and outside during recess. We are off to a great start and our students are doing an amazing job following the Comet Code.



All staff members at Phoenix spent the first week of school spending time getting to know our students and building a positive classroom environment. We will be moving forward with our academics as we complete an assessment with our English Language Arts curriculum. Students will also be taking the MAP (Measure of Academic Progress) test in the areas of reading and math. The MAP assessment window is September 27-October 21. Please encourage your child to do their best.







Prevention, Intervention, and Enrichment

ALL STUDENTS IN THE MIDDLE SCHOOL HAVE ONE CLASS PERIOD MONDAY THROUGH THURSDAY CALLED PIE TIME.

Students are placed into a class based on their scores from different assessments and teacher observations. PIE classes change three times throughout the school year. Our first round started on Monday, September 12th. The opportunities for students in this first round focus on interventions for reading and math and extension activities for students in the areas of math, reading, Spanish literature circles, band, orchestra, and choir. Ask your child about what PIE class they are in and what they are working on!

Adaptive resources to support and further student learning

LEXIA® CORE5® READING IS AN ADAPTIVE BLENDED **LEARNING PROGRAM** that accelerates the development of literacy skills for students of all abilities, helping them make that critical shift from learning to read to reading to learn. Our students have begun using this online resource during their intervention and enrichment time to help fill any skill gaps as well as to continue to move them forward in their learning. Dreambox is another adaptive online resource that our students use regularly during their math instructional block. Dreambox lessons are designed around the standards and adapt in real time while students work. Students can use either Core5® Reading or Dreambox math while at home too! It's important to note that students are to work on the lessons without adult assistance to allow the program to adapt appropriately.

We are off to a great start for the 2022-2023 school year at Parien Elementary School! We welcome all of the new students and their families that have joined us this year. May this be a great year for everyone!

Pelavan-Parien School Pistrict hosted its 1st Hope Squad Student Retreat in late August with six current
Darien students attending along with others from
grades 5-12. Hope Squad members spent time learning
a portion of this year's curriculum, team building, and
learning from our Hope Squad building advisors Mrs.
Hooverson, Mrs. Cardelli, and Mrs. Hemmerich. Hope
Squad members and advisors will meet monthly to plan
and promote activities around positive mental health,
school safety, anti-bullying, school connectedness, and
friendship. We will also participate in district and county
wide activities with other Hope Squads as well.



Several teachers gathered this summer to review reading, math, behavior and attendance data in order to make school improvement goals for the coming

year. These team members are working with other Darien staff to put the finishing touches on the goals and activities for the year. Here's a brief summary: The reading team determined a need to focus on the areas of key ideas and details as this was a lower performing area by our students on state and district assessments. Math teachers noticed that measurement and data is an area of focus, along with building academic math vocabulary. The PBIS team noted that last year there was an increase in the number of student behavior referrals related to defiance and disrespect, so the PBIS team and teachers will focus on this for the coming year. The attendance team felt it was important to educate parents of the importance of regular attendance for students, especially those who missed large numbers of days last year. The family engagement team will be hosting several events throughout the year to inform, build school spirit, and bring families together in fun school related events.

Our next family activity is being held in conjunction with the high school Homecoming football game on September 23rd. All students will receive a free ticket to the football game, scheduled for 7:00pm. Attending students drop their ticket into the container for a chance to win a school prize. At least one adult must be present with the student at the game. Plan to come out to see the newly renovated football stadium, support the Comet football team, and give your child a chance to win a prize!

adapt to everyday challenges and new expectations. This process takes time, and the support between home and school helps the process. Families can help by talking to their children about their feelings and experiences. Children thrive in predictable environments built around positive relationships.

Conference Affiliation

The 2022-2023 school year starts the last year that Delavan-Darien will be a member of the Southern Lakes Conference. High School sports will be participating against Badger High School, Burlington High School, Elkhorn High School, Union Grove High School, Waterford High School, Westosha Central High School and Wilmot High School for the last time as members of the Southern Lakes Conference in the sports of Cross Country, Girls and Boys Soccer, Girls Volleyball, Girls and Boys Swimming, Girls and Boys Tennis, Girls and Boys Basketball, Wrestling, Baseball, Softball, Golf and Track and Field.

Variety and JV 2 Football teams start play this year in the Rock Valley Conference. The Rock Valley Football conference has the Comets facing: East Troy, Jefferson, Whitewater, Evansville, Edgerton, Monroe and McFarland. All the DDHS High School sport teams will enter the Rock Valley Conference in the fall of 2023. The Comets have played many of these teams in recent years for non-conference events and in the WIAA Tournament series. While Delavan-Darien High School has enjoyed our time as a charter member of the Southern Lakes Conference, we look forward to the move into the Rock Valley Conference for more competitive balance for our sporting teams.

Middle School Athletic Conference

The Phoenix Middle School participates in the Southern Lakes Middle School conference with Burlington, Elkhorn, East Troy, Lake Geneva and Waterford, in the sports of Cross Country, Girls and Boys Basketball, Girls Volleyball, Wrestling and Boys and Girls Track and Field. Events are kept local with no early release times for away events. Most events start at 3:45 and finish by 5:30. Practices are right after school at Phoenix Middle School.
