PLEASE NOTE: If you submit only ACT scores, you need to have **18 or higher in ENGLISH, 22 or higher in Math, and 22 or higher in READING**. If you do not have these scores, you may take the Accuplacer or Aleks placement tests in the area in which you did not meet that benchmark.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:

1. Question: Are Metro students permitted to take any college class they want?

Answer: No. There are some classes that students cannot take in this program. Students must meet all pre-requisites to register for a class. Some classes or programs may be inaccessible due to other considerations such as age requirements, high school graduations requirements, and other course or program requirements.

2. Question: Are Metro students permitted to register for as many credits as they would like?

Answer: No. You must consult with your high school and/or college counselor for more details on how many courses you can take each semester.

3. Question: Are Metro students required to participate in the Orientation session?

Answer: Yes. All new students will participate in an orientation session prior to the start of their first semester. Metro students will be invited to an in-person orientation session. In-person orientation is strongly suggested for students taking courses on campus. Students taking courses online or in their high schools may attend in-person orientation or may choose to complete the online orientation.

4. Question: Will my Columbus State grades be part of my high school transcript?

Answer: Yes. Columbus State course grades will show on your high school transcript and will be computed into your Grade Point Average (GPA). College courses will be weighted (on a 5.0 scale). By taking courses at Columbus State, you are establishing a college transcript that will be part of your academic record throughout your educational career.

5. Question: Once I have signed up for my classes at Columbus State, am I responsible for buying the required textbooks for my course(s)?

Answer: Most students do not pay for books for their classes. Metro generally helps to pay for the cost of books. Please contact your Academic Advisor for more information on how to get books for your classes.

ADDITIONAL IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- Admission to Columbus State does not guarantee admission to a specific program or course. Students must meet course placement and/or prerequisites for all courses. Prerequisites will NOT be waived. Pre-college courses are not eligible.
- The Dual Credit (College Credit Plus) Office will communicate with you throughout the admissions process to let you know your next steps. This will be done via email, using the personal email address you used to complete the admissions application. **It is very important that you check your email throughout the admissions process.**
