Pekin Community High School will be administering the Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT) on Wednesday, October 10th. This would be great practice for the SAT! There are a limited number of tests available so it is on a first-come, first-serve basis. The deadline to sign-up for the PSAT/NMSQT is Thursday, October 4th. The test cost is \$16 per student and payment is due at the time of sign-up. All interested students will need to sign-up at the BFO with Mrs. Grashoff.

Junior Family Night

Thursday, November 15th from 6:00-7:30 PM

The Pekin Community High School Counseling Department will host a Junior Family Night: Life After High School planning meeting for juniors and their parents/guardians on Thursday, November 15, from 6:00 – 7:30 p.m. in the theater. The purpose of the meeting is to present information on post-secondary options, including the military, two-year and four-year colleges, and trade and technical training. Among the topics to be discussed will be the research process, the use of Career Cruising in helping to identify post-high school options, the importance of visits, admission requirements, the application process, scholarship/financial aid information, and skills needed to be successful in the workplace. Information will also be presented for students who wish to participate in college athletics.

In addition to hearing from the counselors, representatives from various institutions will also present information and answer questions. The PCHS counselors urge all juniors and their parents/guardians to attend this meeting. The information presented will be very helpful in the planning process after high school.



Rtl – Attendance Matters! Are you missing fewer than 2 days of school each month?



DID YOU KNOW?



Missing more 3 days or more a month on average equates to missing more than 10% of the school year and is considered chronic absenteeism/truancy.



To improve overall student achievement and be eligible for attendance recognition, students should attend 90% or more school days, which means being absent fewer than 2 days a month.
